



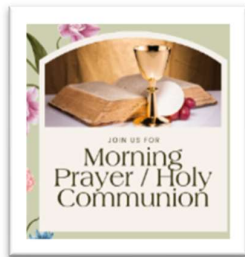

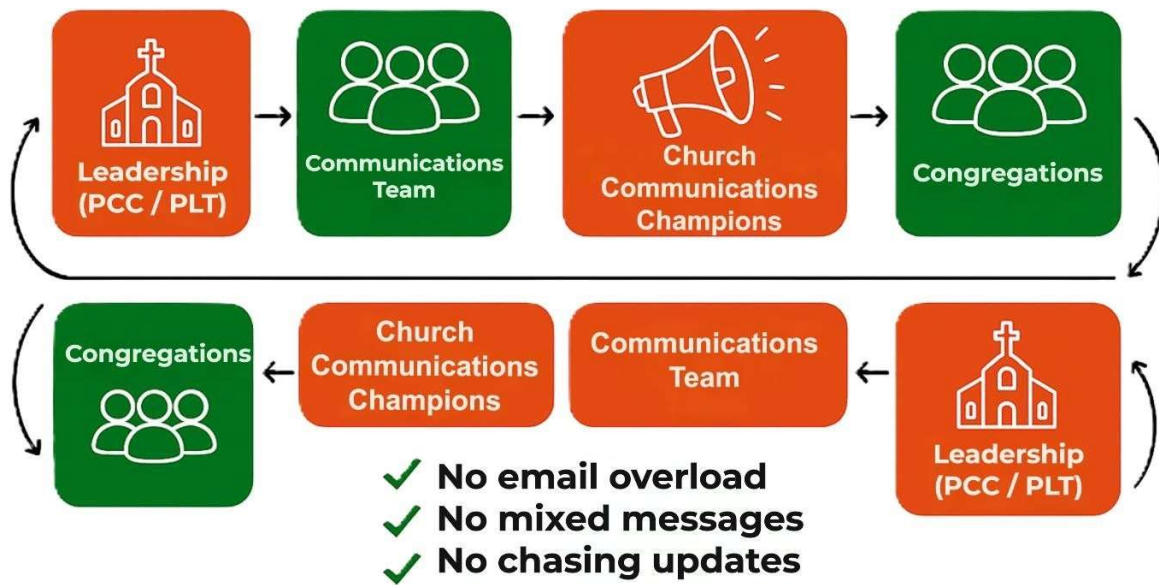

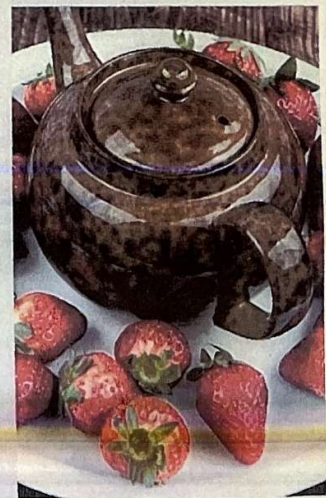

Joke of the month

A police officer called the station on his radio. "I need backup here," he says, "the vicar's wife has shot her husband for stepping on the floor she has just mopped." The sergeant asks, "have you arrested this woman?" "Not yet," he replies, "the floor is still wet."

Recipe

- **3 x 150g packs Raspberries**
- **7½ tbsp icing sugar**
- **½ unwaxed lemon, zest and juice**
- **3 sheets filo pastry**
- **60g salted butter, melted**
- **200g pack No.1 Barrel Aged Greek Feta, drained (reserve the brine)**
- **250g mascarpone**
- **300ml double cream**
- **85g No.1 British Summer Honey, plus extra for drizzling**
- **50g pistachios, toasted and roughly chopped**
- Preheat the oven to 200°C, gas mark 6. Put the raspberries, 1½ tbsp icing sugar and the lemon juice in a bowl, stir to coat, then set aside for at least 30 minutes.
- Meanwhile, line a baking tray with baking parchment. Lay a sheet of filo on the tray; brush with a little of the melted butter and sift 1 tbsp of the icing sugar evenly over the top. Repeat with the remaining sheets of filo, finishing with butter and sugar. Bake for 10-15 minutes until a deep golden brown, then set aside to cool completely on the tray.
- For the cheesecake cream, put the feta in the bowl of a food processor along with 4 tbsp of feta brine. Whizz until the mixture is as smooth as possible, then transfer to a large bowl. Add the lemon zest, mascarpone, cream and honey. Sift in the final 3 tbsp icing sugar and whisk together until the mixture has thickened and holds its shape. Smash the filo sheets into bite-sized shards and serve alongside the bowl of raspberries, the cheesecake cream, extra honey and pistachios so everyone can help themselves.

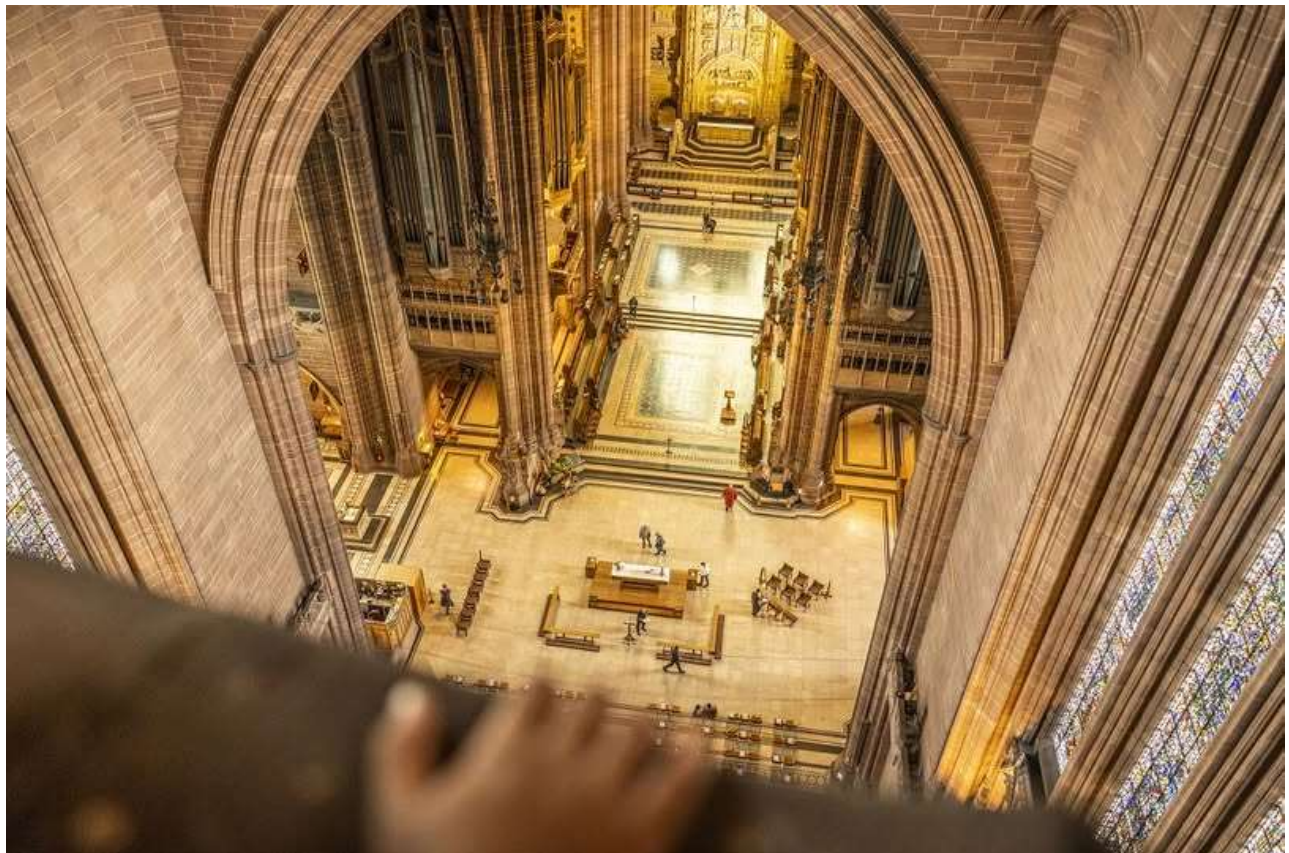

Readings for this month

May 31st Matthew 28 v 16-20

¹⁶ Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. ¹⁷ When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. ¹⁸ Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

June 7th Reading: Luke 12:16 -21.

And he told them this parable: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded an abundant harvest. He thought to himself, 'What shall I do? I have no place to store my crops.' "Then he said, 'This is what I'll do. I will tear down my barns and build bigger ones, and there I will store my surplus grain. And I'll say to myself, "You have plenty of grain laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry." ' "But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?' "This is how it will be with whoever stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward God."

³⁵ Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. ³⁶ When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷ Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. ³⁸ Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

Jesus Sends Out the Twelve

¹⁰ Jesus called his twelve disciples to him and gave them authority to drive out impure spirits and to heal every disease and sickness.

² These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon (who is called Peter) and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; ³ Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; ⁴ Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

⁵ These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Do not go among the Gentiles or enter any town of the Samaritans. ⁶ Go rather to the lost sheep of Israel. ⁷ As you go, proclaim this message: 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.'

Dead to Sin, Alive in Christ

6 What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? ² By no means! We are those who have died to sin; how can we live in it any longer? ³ Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴ We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.

⁵ For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶ For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with,^[a] that we should no longer be slaves to sin— ⁷ because anyone who has died has been set free from sin.

⁸ Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹ For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him. ¹⁰ The death he died, he died to sin once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God.

¹¹ In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

This is the word of the lord, Thanks be to God.

Important Message from your PCC

Volunteers – We Need You!

Volunteering isn't just a role – it's a gift. It's an art where people come together to support a meaningful cause that is close to their hearts, be part of something positive, gain experience and skills and enjoy friendship and community.

You all know far better than we do how much St Michael's relies on its volunteers. Whether it's helping with refreshments, meet and greet, gardening, flower arranging, supporting Heavenly Food, pastoral duties, buildings maintenance, running social events or any of the many other jobs around the church, we simply could not operate without you.

As safeguarding has become an important issue in every area of life, it is now central to everything we do. It cannot be avoided and is now a mandatory requirement. After much discussion and persuasion, the Diocese Safeguarding Team has kindly agreed to give their time and support to help our volunteers complete the Basic Awareness Safeguarding Training Course.

The course introduces participants to the core principles of protecting children, young people and vulnerable adults. It teaches you to recognize signs of abuse, understand your reporting responsibilities and handle concerns safely and appropriately.

Normally, this is completed online, but we understand that not everyone has access to a computer or feels comfortable completing online questionnaires. To make things easier, members of the Diocese Safeguarding Team will be visiting St Michael's Church Hall on:-

Thursday 23rd July, 12.00 - 2.30pm (approx 2 ½ hours) - Coffee/Tea/Biscuits included!

They will help you complete the course and gain your Certificate, which will be valid for three years.

The course is not difficult, but it must be completed in order to continue volunteering within the church. We do not wish to pressure anyone, but the reality is that St Michael's cannot function without its volunteers. Quite simply, without your help, we are dead in the water!

So please, if you are willing and able to continue helping us in any capacity, could you find it in your hearts to sign up for the course.

Sharon has kindly volunteered to become our Parish Safety Officer and, together with Lorna and Jan, forms St Michael's Safeguarding Team supporting this important work. If you can't attend on this date, one of us will happily take you through the course on a one-to-one basis in the office at a time that suits you.

We are very fortunate that the Diocese Safeguarding Team is willing to come right to our doorstep and provide this important training. It's not hard – it's simply something that must now be done.

So, please sign up at the back of church if you are willing and able to continue volunteering with us and attend the course. St Michael's needs you! Thank you.
